GENERAL MEDICAL CAMP REPORT

Date of Camp: 11.06.2025

Place: Organized by Sushruta Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital in Jigani ,Anekal Taluk

Objectives

- To provide accessible medical consultation and basic health assessment to the local community.
- To create health awareness and encourage early identification of common ailments.
- To support underserved populations with free medical guidance and preliminary treatment.
- To strengthen community engagement through health outreach activities.

Activities Conducted

- General health check-up for all attending patients.
- Basic diagnosis and preliminary Ayurvedic medical advice.
- Recording of vitals including blood pressure, pulse, and general health indicators.
- Distribution of necessary medications as per consultant's advice.
- Health counseling on diet, lifestyle, and preventive care.
- Referral of patients requiring further medical evaluation.

Outcomes

- **Total Patients Attended:36**
 - **Male: 12**
 - **Female:24**
- Increased awareness of common health issues among community members.
- Early detection of several minor ailments with appropriate follow-up advice.
- Positive feedback received from patients for the accessibility and quality of service.

Future Plans

- Conduct similar medical camps at regular intervals to ensure continuity of community healthcare support.
- Introduce specialized health camps focusing on women's health, diabetes, hypertension, and geriatric care.
- Collaborate with more medical institutions for multidisciplinary support.
- Maintain a follow-up mechanism for patients identified with chronic conditions.
